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ABSTRACT




Figure 1. Portrait Classification




Figure 2. The Symbolic Meaning of Music in a Portrait




Figure 3. Identity Mapping




Figure 5. Dynamic Sense of Han Dynasty Stone Relief in Anhui

glimpse of the Han Dynasty music culture. These images are not only ancient artworks but also an important window into Han society, culture and music. Through the analysis of images, we can restore the ancient music scene, feel the skills of Han Dynasty musicians, and the influence of music on the life of ancient people.

This study highlights the importance of cultural images that not only reflect the aesthetics and values of a particular period but also carry a wealth of historical information. However, it is also important to note that the interpretation of images may be affected by subjective factors of the researcher, so a multi-angle, multi-disciplinary approach is the key to a deep understanding of ancient culture.

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
